

COVID-19 UPDATE

Actions by Kings Point residents and others living in NY have helped to reduce the spread of COVID-19 in NY State to one of the lowest rates in the nation. As Village of Kings Point officials continue to do everything possible for the protection of public health and safety, citizens are encouraged to remain vigilant for the protection of their families, loved ones and neighbors.

Cases on Rise in Kings Point

With a recent uptick in cases of COVID-19 cases reported in Kings Point and throughout the Great Neck Peninsula, it is more important than ever for residents to abide by NY State requirements and follow CDC guidelines:

- Cover your nose & mouth with a cloth face mask when you must go out in public.
 - Maintain a 6-foot distance from others.
- Wash your hands often with soap & water or use hand sanitizer.
 - Avoid touching your eyes, nose & mouth.
 - Disinfect frequently-touched surfaces daily.

NY State Travel Advisory

All travelers entering NY who are coming from states with significant rates of transmission of COVID-19, are now required to quarantine for a 14-day period, consistent with NY State Department of Health regulations for quarantine. This currently includes Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Texas, Arizona, California and approximately 15 other states.

Get Tested

To help combat and contain novel coronavirus, the state is testing tens of thousands of residents a day. If you are concerned about COVID-19 and would like to get tested, go to the state website and take an online assessment.

If you are experiencing symptoms or believe you have been exposed to COVID-19, contact your health professional. Avoid going out in public and isolate yourself from others in the household for 14 days.

First Responders on Call

Members of the Village of Kings Point Police Department are standing by around-the-clock to answer calls for help from the community, including those who may be experiencing a health emergency. Officers are well-trained in hygiene protocols and first-aid response procedures. Patrol cars are equipped with oxygen, automatic defibrillators and other supplies for administering first aid.

Volunteer members of the Vigilant Fire Company, which provides Kings Point residents with emergency ambulance services, are on call as well, to provide medical assistance when needed.
