## **TROPICAL STORM ISAIAS RESPONSE**

Since Tropical Storm Isaias hit the Great Neck Peninsula and the rest of Long Island, Kings Point Village officials have been working around-the-clock to ensure that the village's roadways are passable and electricity is restored to the area as soon as possible.

At this point, we are estimating that about half of Kings Point's residents are without power and PSEG is challenged with restoring power to more than 350,000 people throughout Nassau and Suffolk Counties.

Kings Point Mayor Michael Kalnick has been in constant contact with PSEG officials to secure an estimated timeframe for when service will be restored to Kings Point. He has been assured that the utility is doing everything possible to get the power turned back on as soon as possible. With PSEG crews currently working in Kings Point, PSEG executives have told Mayor Kalnick that power is expected to be restored to the majority of the homes sometime tomorrow.

The village's highway crews have been working non-stop to remove downed trees, branches and debris from village roadways, with the exception of areas where downed electric lines are energized and require assistance from PSEG before those roads can be cleared. Residents are urged to stay away from those areas to avoid electrocution.

The Kings Point Police Department is fully staffed and has been working alongside volunteer members of Alert Fire Company to ensure the safety of our residents. Village officials will continue to reach out to PSEG for updates and to request a faster response until electricity is fully restored.
